Yearly Breakdown of PREA Investigations

2022

Overview

The Grayson County Detention Center investigated **14** PREA-reportable incidents in the calendar year of 2022.

Ten allegations were determined to be unfounded following investigative procedures.

Two allegations of unsubstantiated harassment were alleged to have occurred, resulting in minor disciplinary action being taken.

Two other allegations were reported to have occurred at other facilities, and referred accordingly for further investigation.


Agency Efforts

The Grayson County Detention Center continues to make every effort to educate staff, volunteers and inmates on PREA issues. Our reporting methods remain unchanged from previous years and all inmates are provided upon intake with PREA reporting information. The Grayson County Detention Center has implemented updated screening tools, training and educational materials for both, employees and inmates.


